- As of 2021 the region's population **increased by 7.6%** since 2016, growing by 4,854. Population is expected to **increase by 1.0%** between 2021 and 2026, adding 699.
- From 2016 to 2021, jobs **declined by 1.1%** in Lake County, CA from 17,156 to **16,961**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 1.9% by 3.0%**. As the number of jobs declined, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 55.7% to 50.5% between 2016 and 2021**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **11.0% of Lake County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (9.4% below the national average), and **11.7% hold an Associate's Degree** (3.0% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2021 are Individual and Family Services, Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).

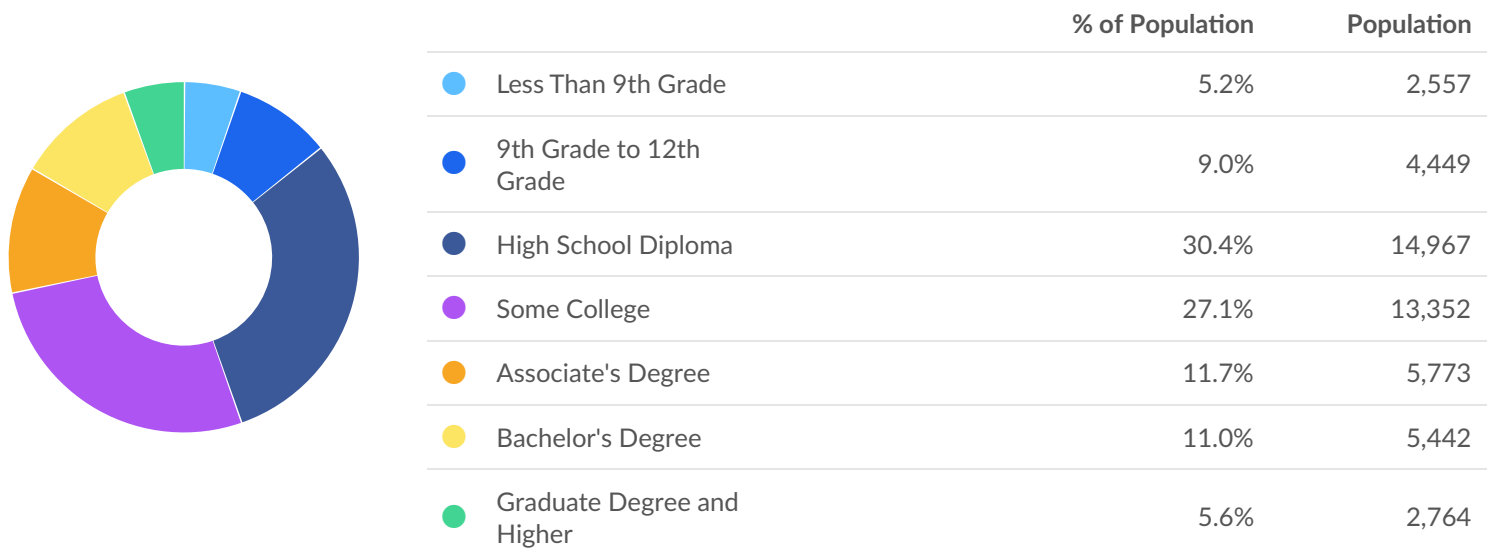

Sep 2022 Labor Force Breakdown



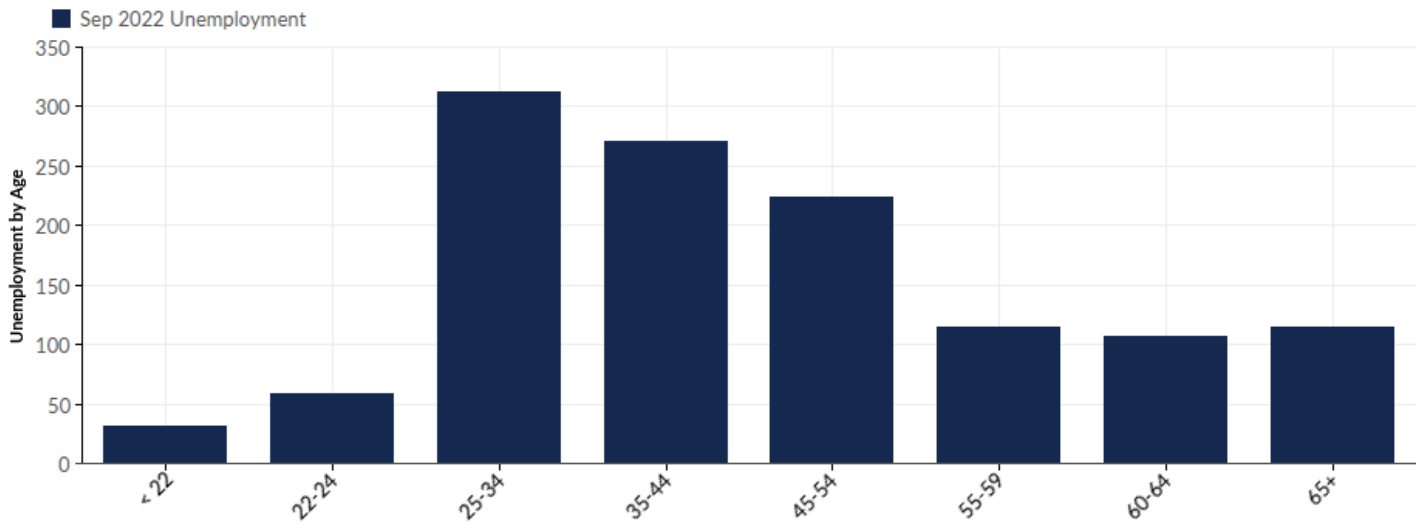
Educational Attainment

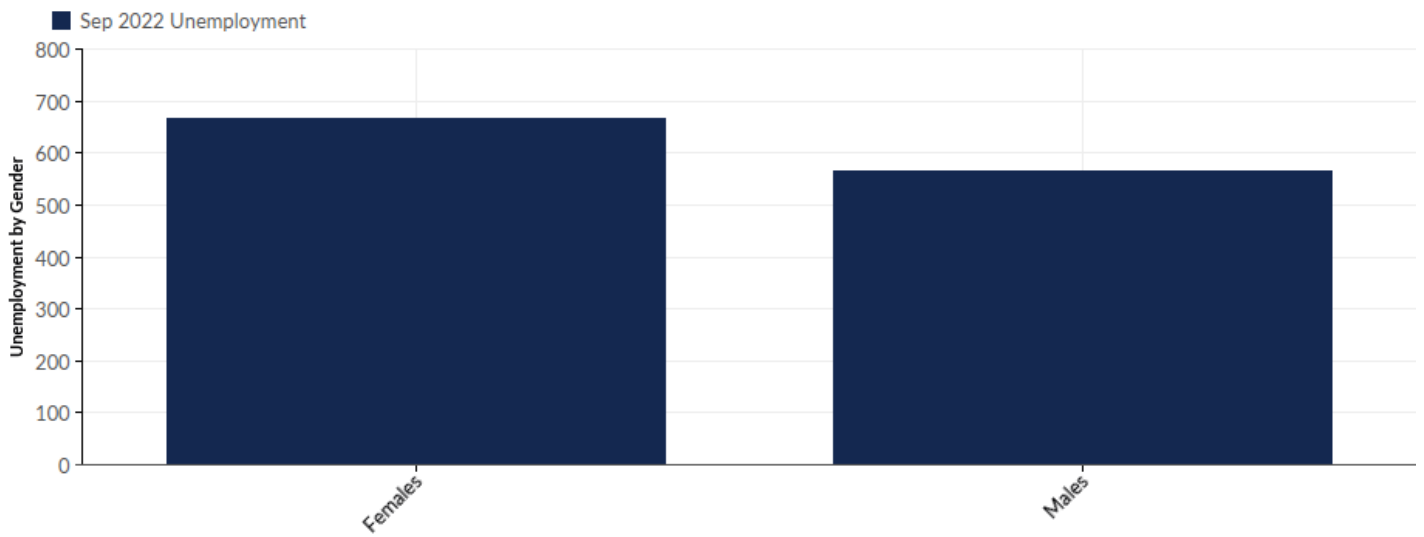

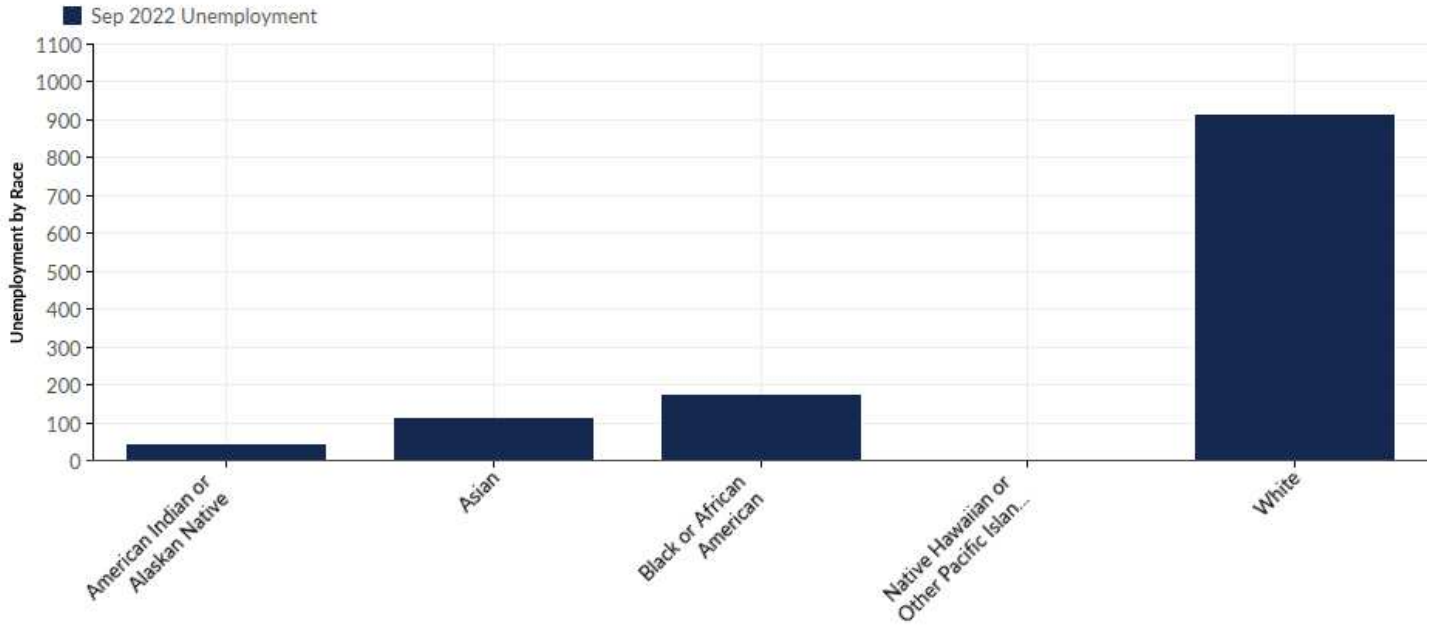

Unemployment by Gender



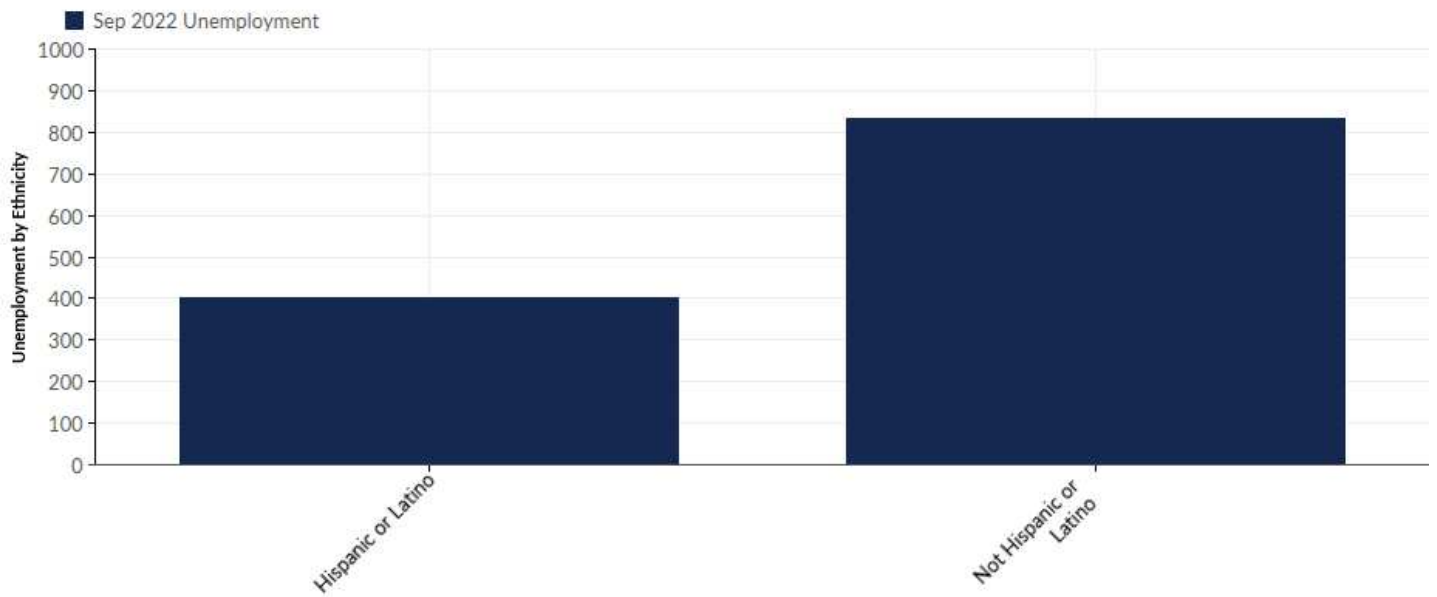

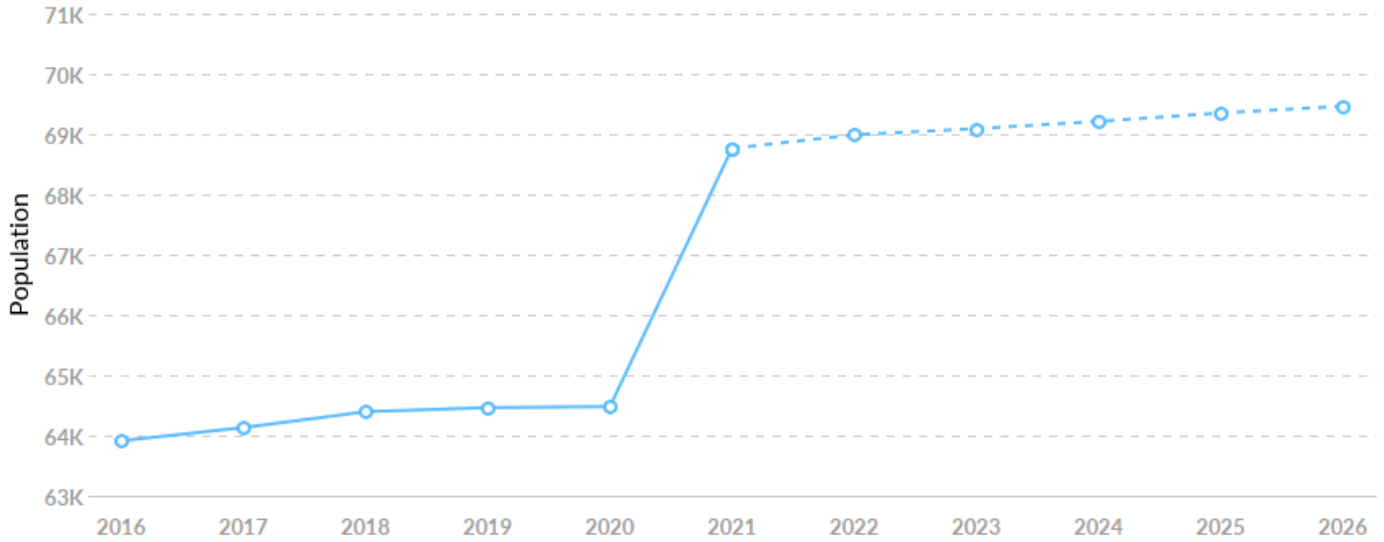

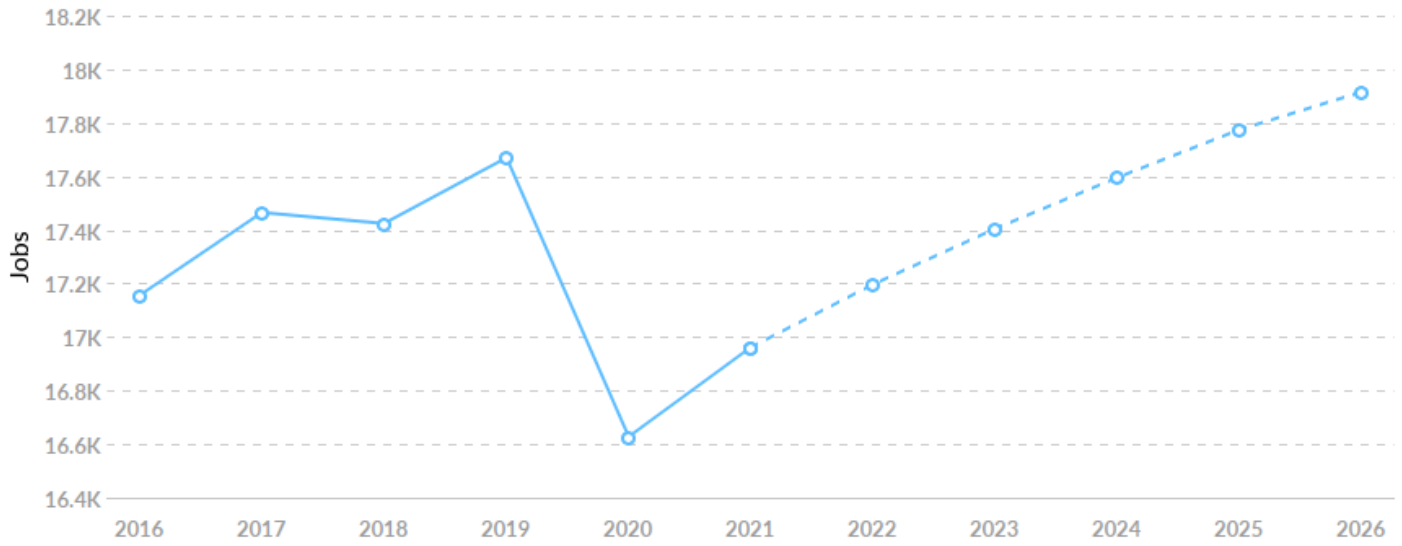

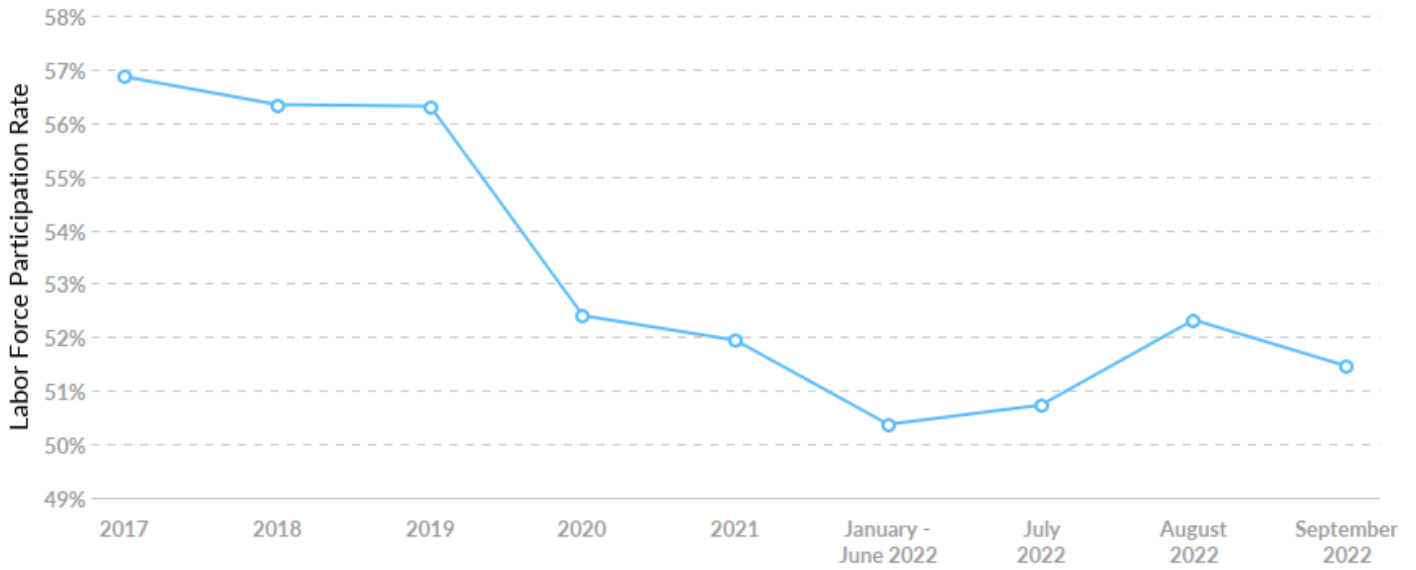
Job Trends

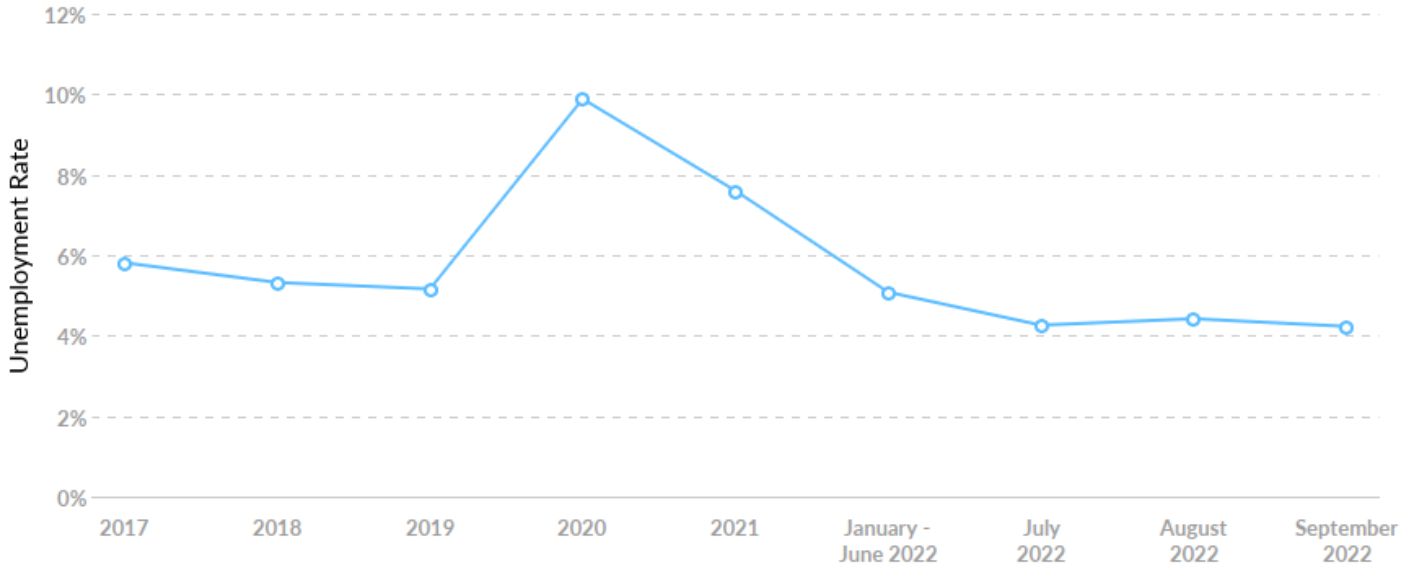

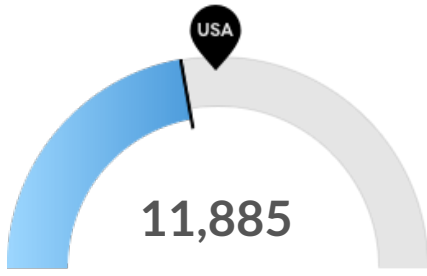
Unemployment Rate Trends

Lake County, CA had a September 2022 unemployment rate of 4.23%, **decreasing from 5.81%** 5 years before.



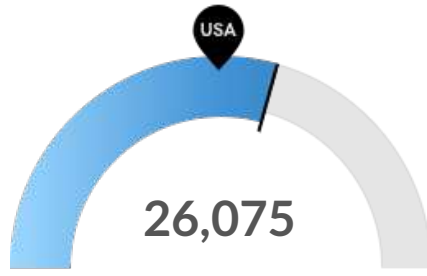

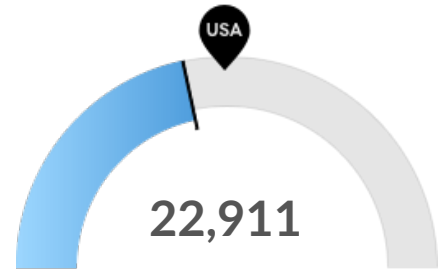
Millennials

Lake County, CA has 11,885 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 14,047.



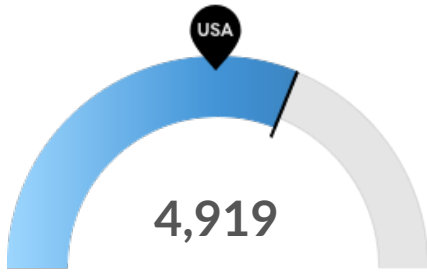
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Lake County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 20,440 people 55 or older, while there are 26,075 here.



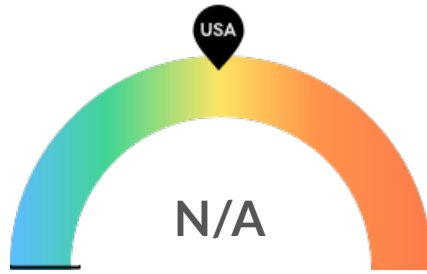
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Lake County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 27,984 racially diverse people, while there are 22,911 here.



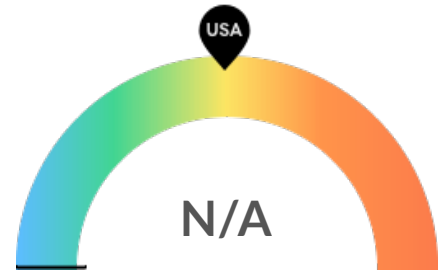
Veterans

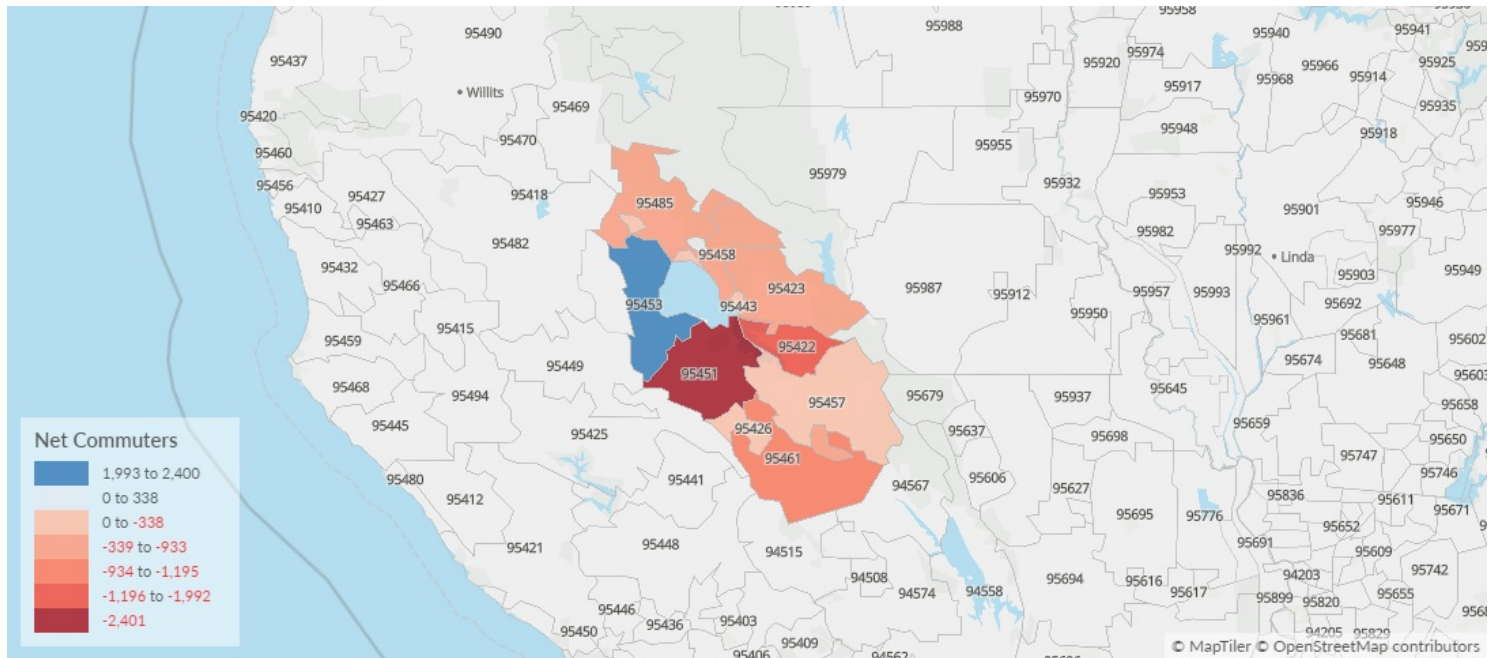

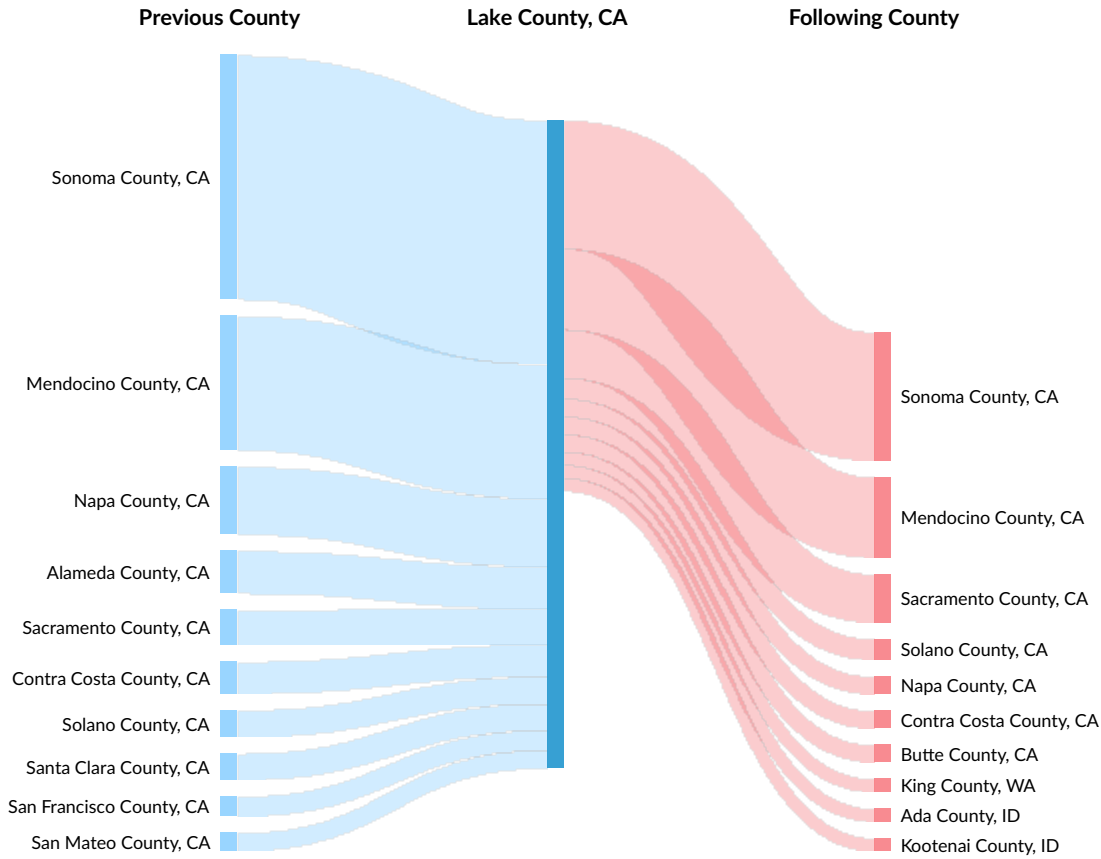

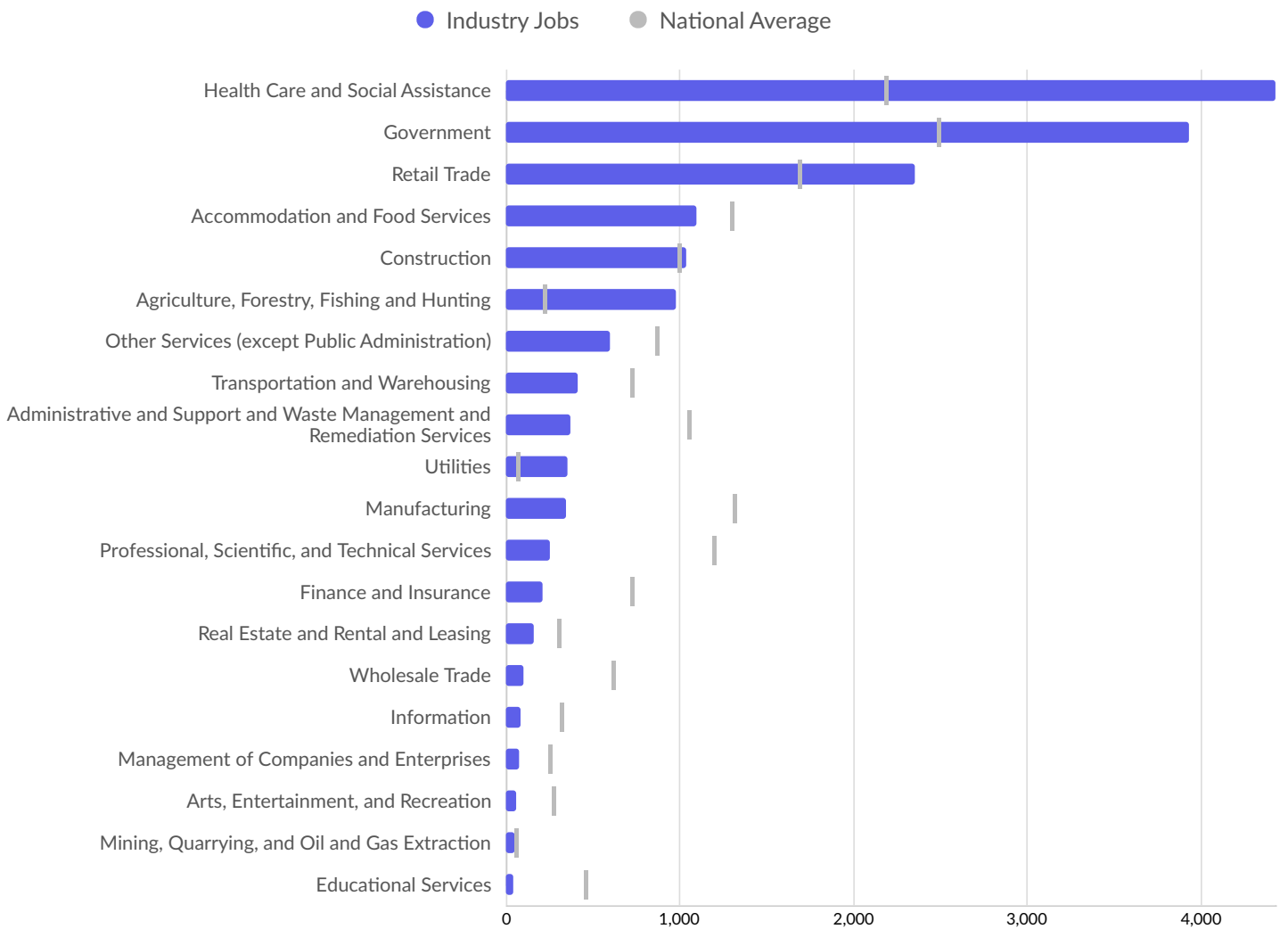

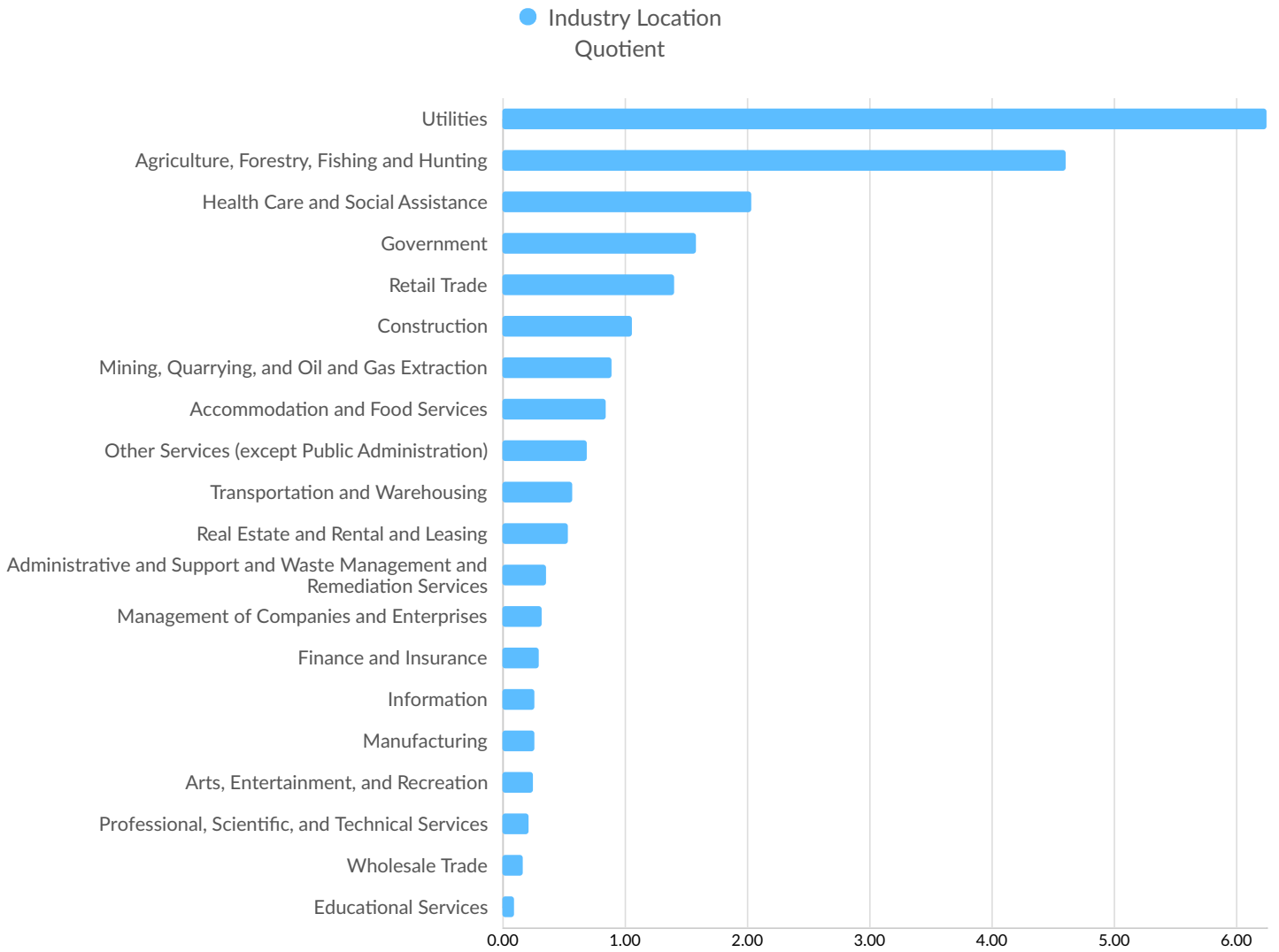

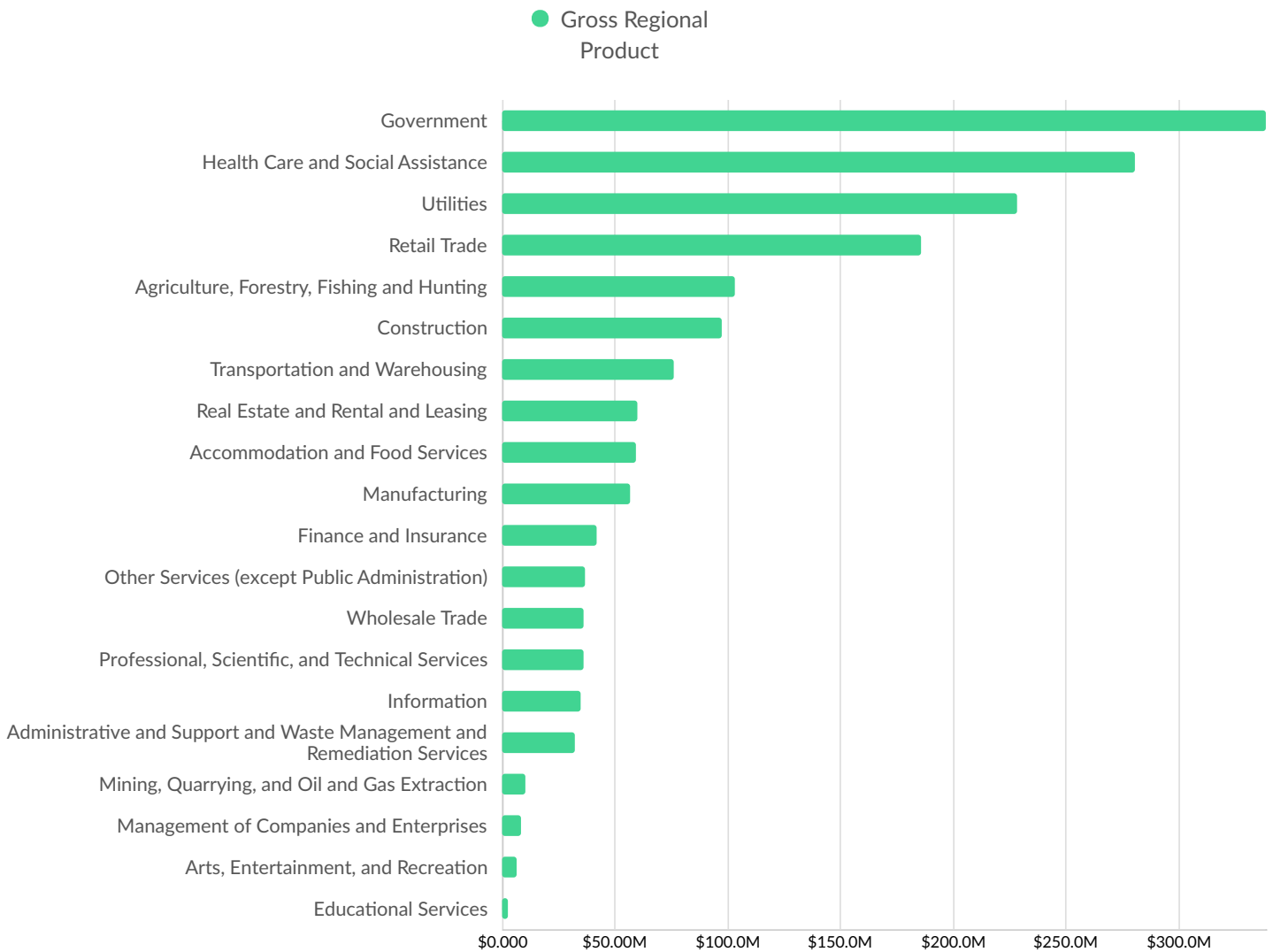
Top Growing Industries



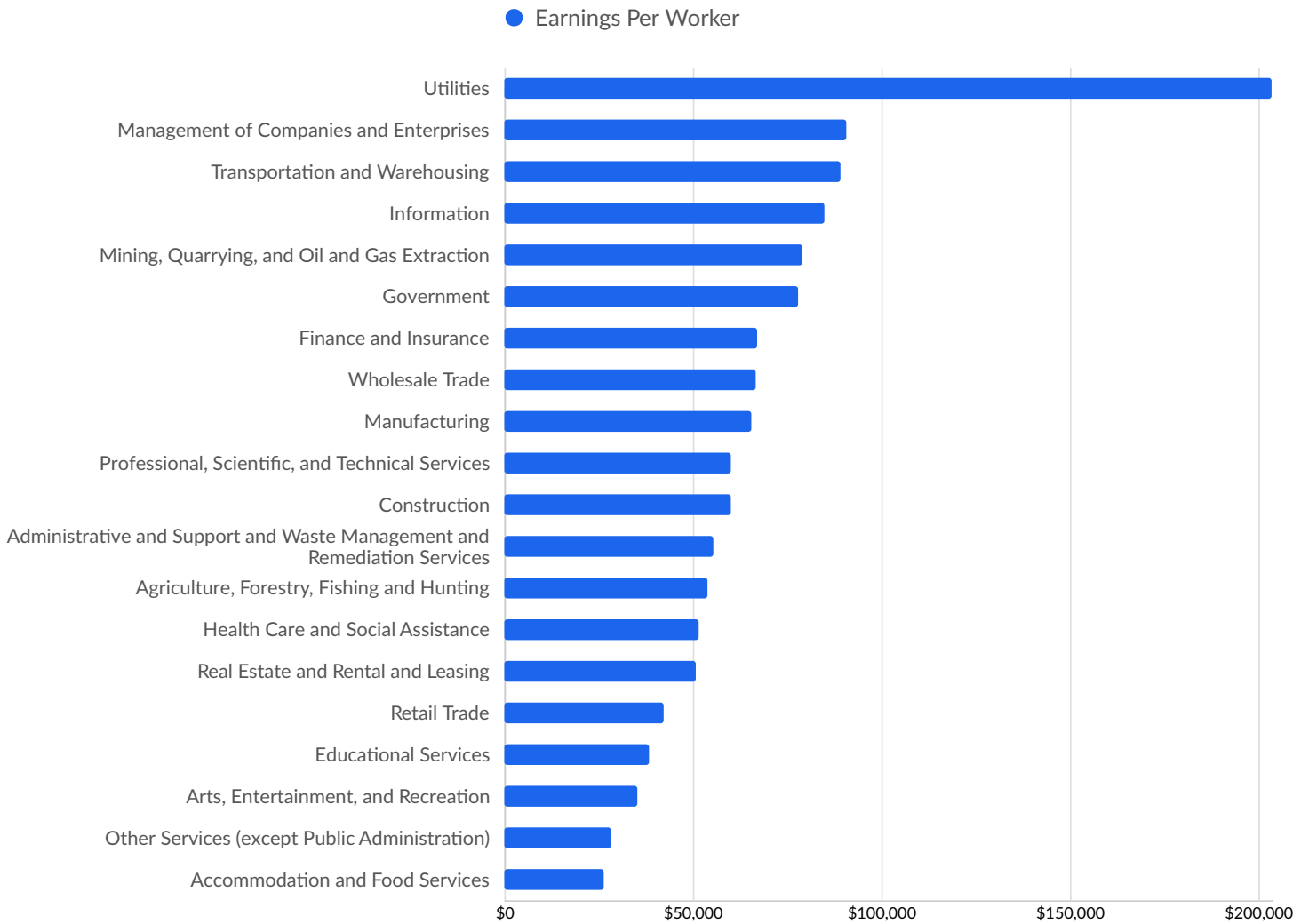
Top Industry Location Quotient

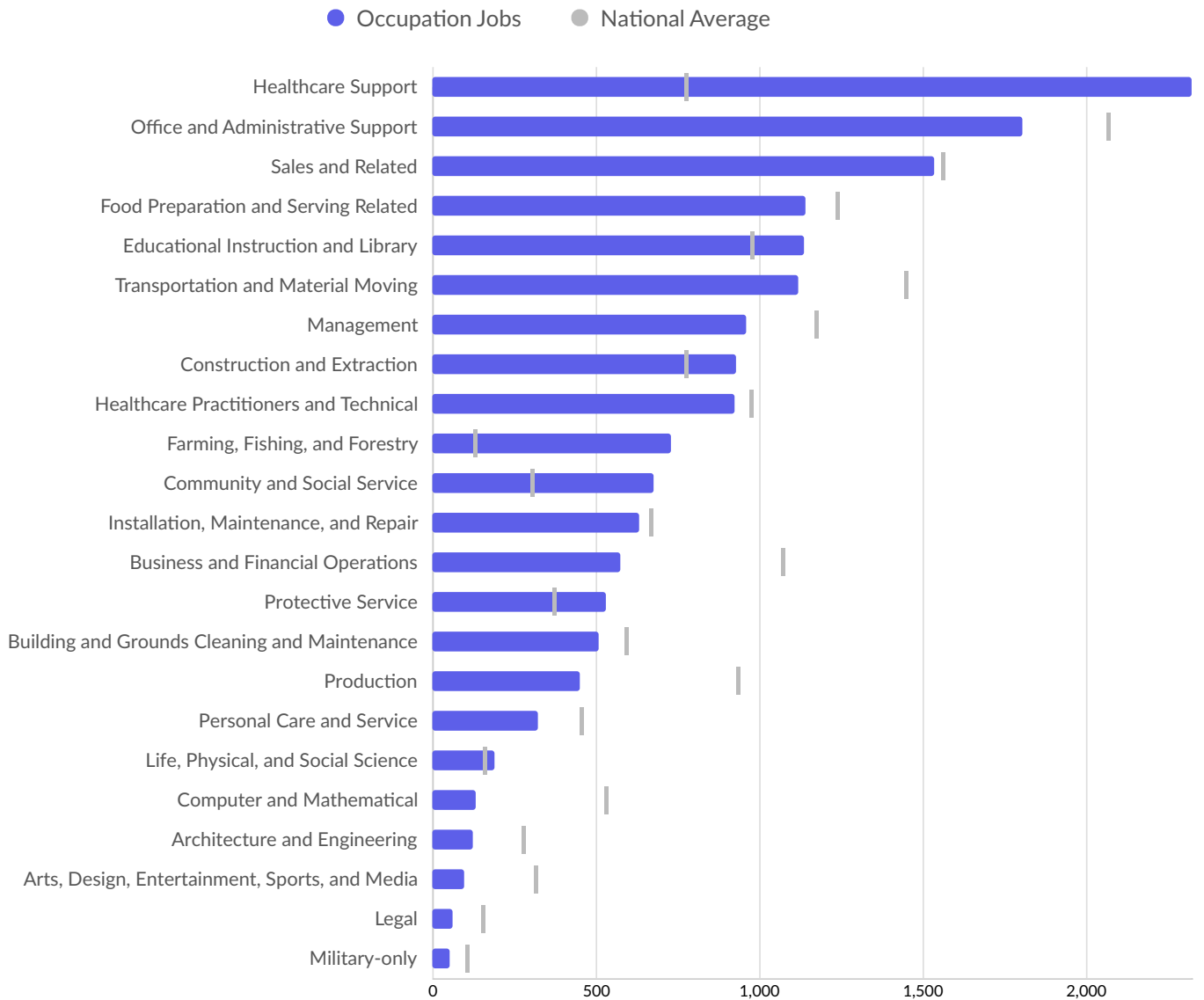

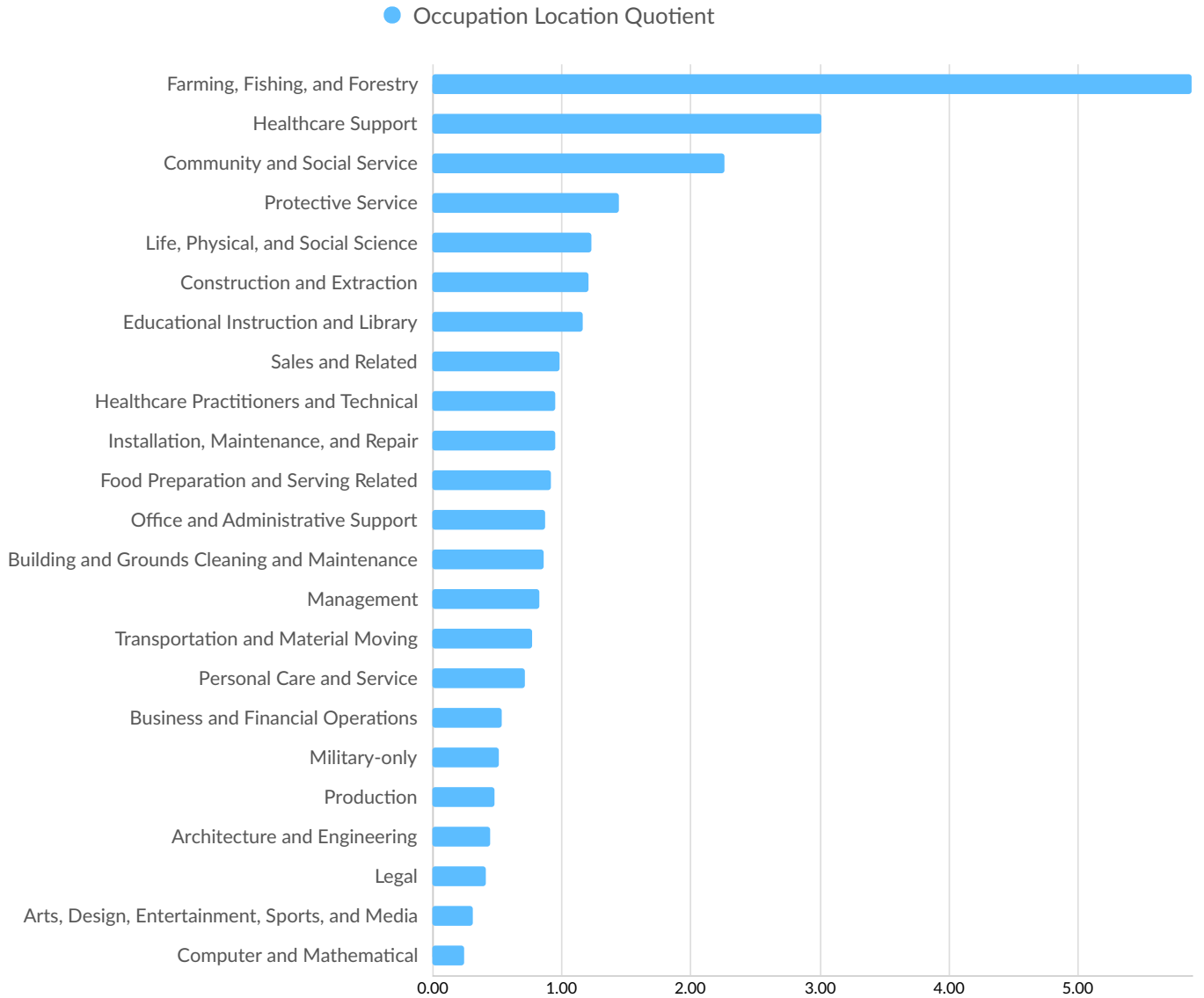

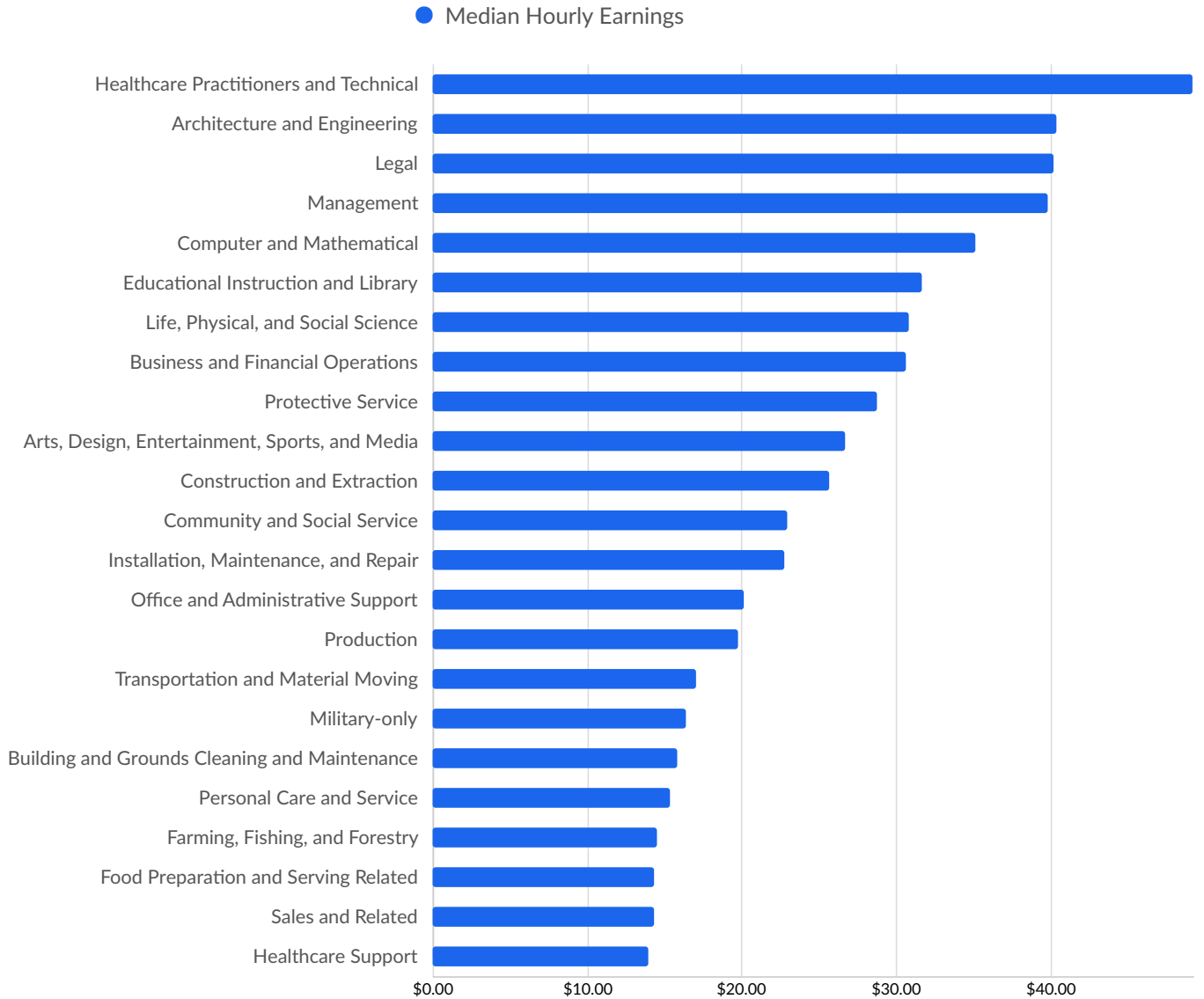
Top Growing Occupations



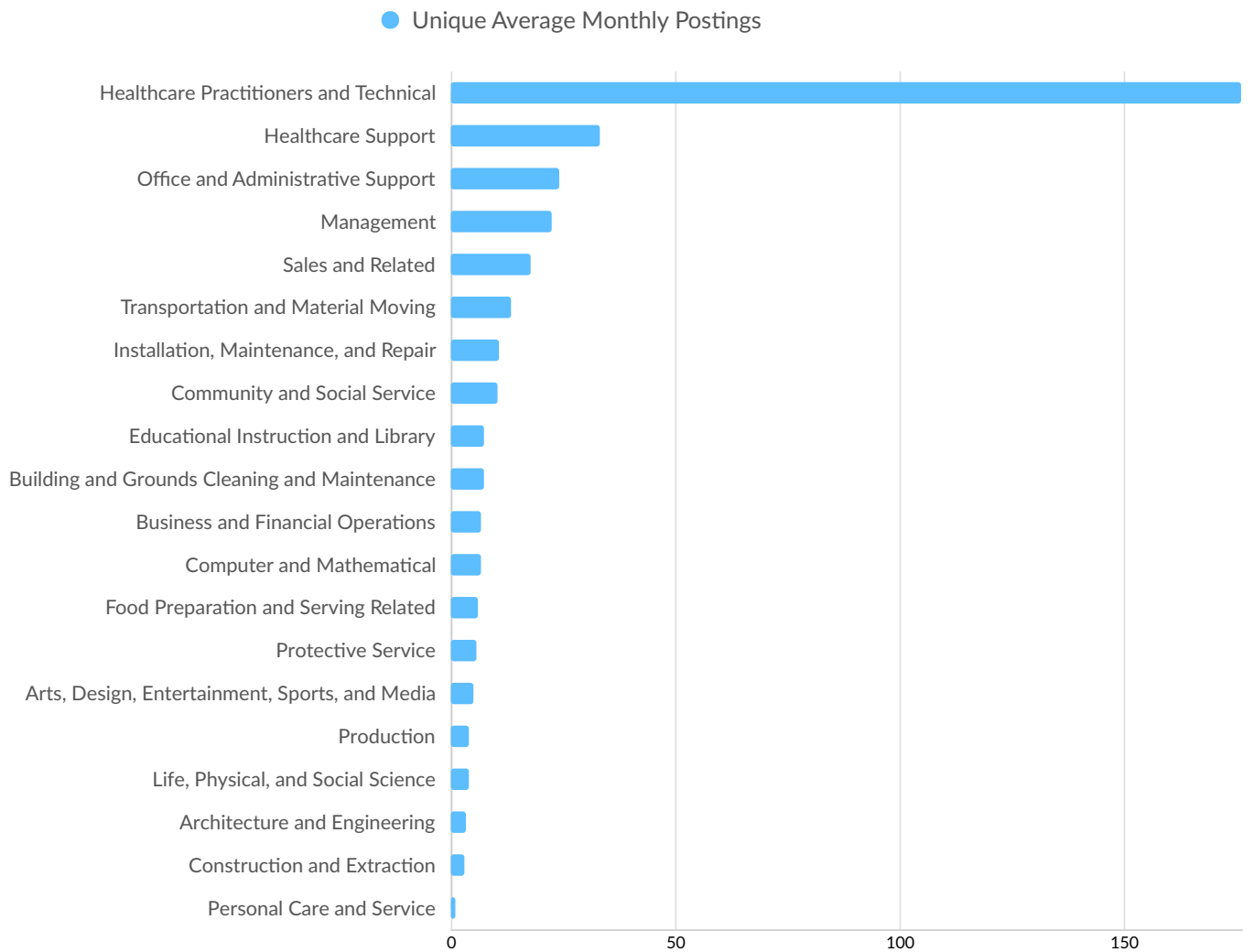
Top Occupation Location Quotient



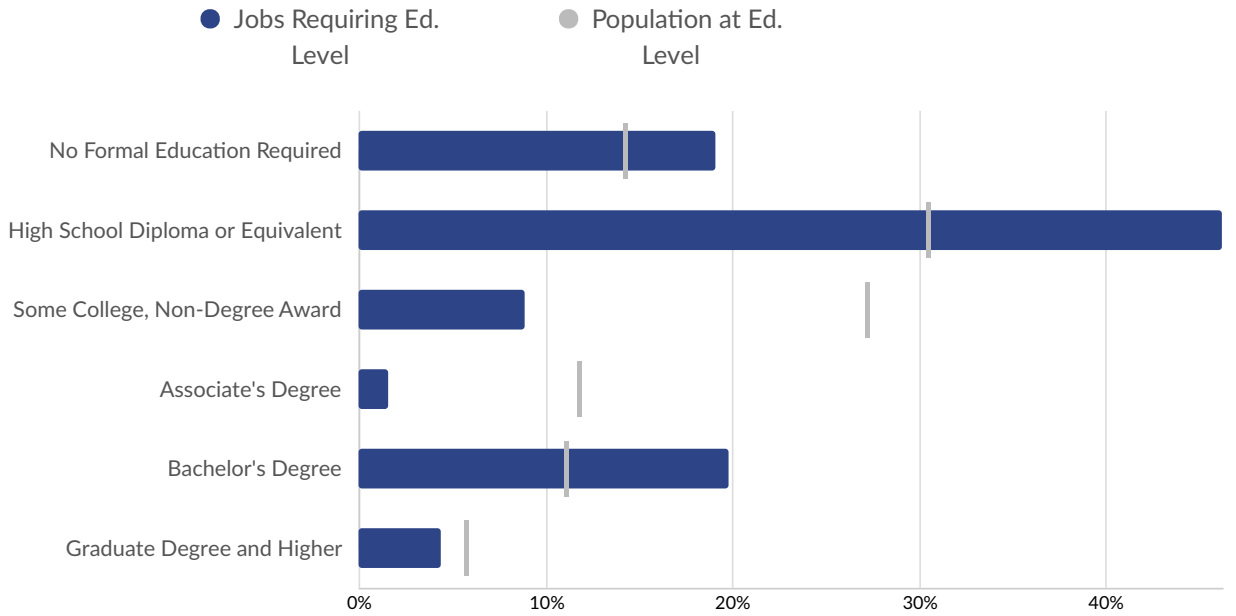
