Median household income is \$12.6K below the national median household income of \$69.0K.


Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 2.4% since 2017, growing by 2,093. Population is expected to increase by 8.9% between 2022 and 2027, adding 7,961.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs declined by 2.5% in Mendocino County, CA from 38,616 to 37,645. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.8% by 6.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 55.9% to 51.2% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.4% of Mendocino County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.5% below the national average), and **8.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.4% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity









Labor Force Participation Rate Trends




Mendocino County, CA had a September 2023 unemployment rate of 4.55%, increasing from 4.01% 5 years before.




Millennials

Mendocino County, CA has 14,824 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 18,256.




Retiring Soon

Racial diversity is about average in Mendocino County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 36,922 racially diverse people, while there are 33,940 here.




Veterans

Mendocino County, CA has 4.02 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.59 per 1,000 people.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP








Top Growing Occupations






Top Occupation Employment Concentration




