- From 2017 to 2022, jobs declined by 0.3% in Napa County, CA from 86,806 to 86,543. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.8% by 4.1%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 63.4% to 63.4% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **24.7% of Napa County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (3.9% above the national average), and **8.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.1% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Beverage Manufacturing, Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Traveler Accommodation.




Sep 2023 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender







Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends




Napa County, CA had a September 2023 unemployment rate of 3.49%, increasing from 2.97% 5 years before.




Millennials

Napa County, CA has 24,743 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 27,308.




Veterans

Napa County, CA has 6,280 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 7,151.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Napa County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 40,247 people 55 or older, while there are 46,503 here.




Violent Crime










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP





Top Occupation Employment Concentration




