Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population declined by 2.4% since 2019, falling by 6,292. Population is expected to decrease by 3.0% between 2024 and 2029, losing 7,702.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 5.4% in Marin County, CA from 141,219 to 133,648. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 9.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 65.8% to 62.6% between 2019 and 2024.
- Concerning educational attainment, 33.5% of Marin County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (12.0% above the national average), and 6.4% hold an Associate's Degree (2.6% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Private Households.



Dec 2024 Labor Force Breakdown




Educational Attainment





Unemployment by Gender





Unemployment by Ethnicity



Population Trends




Job Trends


Unemployment Rate Trends


Millennials

Marin County, CA has 34,832 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 51,691.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Marin County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 76,799 people 55 or older, while there are 100,936 here.




Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Marin County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 105,953 racially diverse people, while there are 83,352 here.




Veterans

Marin County, CA has 2.51 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.54 per 1,000 people.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration








Top Occupation Employment Concentration




Top Occupation Earnings
