Median household income is \$13.9K below the national median household income of \$78.5K.


Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population increased by 2.6% since 2019, growing by 2,244. Population is expected to increase by 0.1% between 2024 and 2029, adding 109.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 1.5% in Mendocino County, CA from 38,336 to 37,742. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.1% by 5.6%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 53.7% to 49.8% between 2019 and 2024.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.8% of Mendocino County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.7% below the national average), and **9.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.3% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Individual and Family Services.






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends




Mendocino County, CA had an April 2025 unemployment rate of 5.52%, decreasing from 9.49% 5 years before.




Population Characteristics

Mendocino County, CA has 14,588 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 18,105.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Mendocino County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 26,900 people 55 or older, while there are 33,737 here.




Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is about average in Mendocino County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 37,111 racially diverse people, while there are 33,870 here.




Veterans

Mendocino County, CA has 2.09 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.54 per 1,000 people.




Property Crime










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP






Top Growing Occupations






Top Occupation Employment Concentration







Educational Pipeline

In 2023, there were 504 graduates in Mendocino County, CA. This pipeline has grown by 44% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Certificate), "Health/Medical Preparatory Programs, Other" (Associate's), and "Health Services/Allied Health/Health Sciences, General" (Associate's).
