- From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 0.1% in Napa County, CA from 89,295 to 89,182. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.1% by 4.2%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate increased from 64.1% to 67.4% between 2019 and 2024.
- Concerning educational attainment, **24.2% of Napa County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (2.7% above the national average), and **8.3% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.5% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Beverage Manufacturing, Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Traveler Accommodation.




Apr 2025 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends




Napa County, CA had an April 2025 unemployment rate of 3.85%, decreasing from 8.94% 5 years before.




Millennials

Napa County, CA has 24,274 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 27,067.




Veterans

Napa County, CA has 5,911 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 6,591.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Napa County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 40,215 people 55 or older, while there are 46,690 here.




Violent Crime










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP








Top Occupation Employment Concentration


Top Occupation Earnings




